DETAILED ITINERARY

Day 1 Arrive Jeju

Make your way to South Korea's largest island, Jeju, where you will be met by a driver and transferred to your hotel to check in.

Enjoy the rest of your day at leisure.

Flights to Jeju Island are not included in the base package but can be added with a supplement. Please contact our reservations team.

Destination Information

Jeju Island – Jeju Island has long featured as the country's top domestic travel destination, attracting people from across the country with its beautiful beaches, lush countryside and fresh seafood.

Day 2: Jeju Island

This morning, head to the pick-up point to begin your full day tour of Jeju Island (East Course) with a visit to the stunning Jeju Jeolmul Natural Forest, nestled under a baby volcano crater. Afterwards, explore Seongeup Folk Village who's history dates back to 1410.

After lunch, go on to Gwangchigi Beach, offering stunning views of Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak before witnessing a Haenyeo (woman dive) show, showcasing the traditional practice of gathering seafood without any diving equipment.

Your day continues with a visit to Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak, a

UNESCO world Heritage site who's large crater was formed by a volcanic eruption over 100,000 years ago. You will trek for approximately 1 hour here, around the Peak's crown-like structure.

End the day with a visit to Jeju Stone Park all before returning to the drop-off point.

Please note:

- The East Coast course touring is available on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday and Sunday
- The South West and Hallaan Coast course is available on Monday, Wednesday and Friday

If today's date falls on a Tuesday, Thursday or Sunday, your itinerary will operate in the expected order (East Coast first, and South West Coast the following day). However, if today's date falls on a Monday, Wednesday or Friday, your days of touring will be swapped over.

Destination Information

Jeju Jeolmul Natural Forest – Known for its rich biodiversity, the Jeju Jeolmul Natural Forest features dense, lush greenery, unique volcanic landscapes, and a variety of plant and animal species.

Seongeup Folk Village – At the foot of Mt Hall, Seongeup Folk Village holds a vast amount of culture dating back to 1410. With culture handed down through generations, you will find a number of gems here from Confucian shrines to ancient government offices as well as folk plays and a local dialect.

Gwangchigi Beach – A picturesque and peaceful beach known for its stunning black sand, clear waters, and beautiful views of Seongsan Ilchulbong (Sunrise Peak). The beach offers a unique landscape, surrounded by lush fields and dramatic volcanic formations.

Haenyeo (woman dive) show – The show offers a fascinating glimpse into the traditional fishing practices of Jeju Island's renowned female divers, known as "Haenyeo." These skilled women dive into the ocean without oxygen tanks to collect seafood, such as abalone and sea urchins, using only their breath and diving skills. The show highlights their incredible strength, endurance, and deep connection to the sea, showcasing their unique culture and heritage.

Seongsan lichulbong Peak – 5000 years ago, underwater magma flow formed the huge tuff cone of Seongsan Sunrise Peak, which rises some 180 metres above sea level. Over the years, it has become a part of Jeju Island.

Jeju Stone Park – An ecological park, Jeju Stone Park is the perfect display of the longstan stone culture and identity of Jeju Island. The primary theme of the park focuses on the myth of Seolmundae Halmang, which translates to Grandmother Seolmundae, who is believed to have been the legend behind Jeju's origin.



Day 3: Jeju Island

Start your second full day with a seat-in-coach tour of Jeju Island (South West and Hallasan Course) where you will visit the stunning white sands of Hyeopjae Beach. Afterwards, explore Gotjawal, where animals and plants coexist in a forest-like environment in the midst of rocky terrain created by lava flows.

Go on to see the O'Sulloc Museum, where you will be able to view the green tea fields from the observatory. After lunch, continue to Mt Songak, for stunning volcanic landscapes and panoramic views of Halla and Sanbang Mountains.

Continue to Jusangjeolli Hexagon Lava Cliff before ending the day at Mt. Halla 1100 Altitude Wetland offering extraordinary views of Jeju's landscape below.

Destination Information

Hyeopjae Beach – Hyeopjae Beach is well known for the bright white colour of the sand. The long shore stretches 9 kilometres alongside the beautiful cobalt water and evergreen forests.

Gotjawal – A unique forest ecosystem in Jeju Island, characterized by dense, volcanic terrain with a mix of lush subtropical vegetation and lava rock. The Gotjawal forest is home to a variety of rare plant and animal species, and its unique geology, shaped by volcanic activity, creates a distinctive environment.


O'Sulloc Museum – Dedicated to the rich history and culture of tea in Korea, the O'Sulloc Museum showcases the significance of green tea, particularly Jeju's famous O'Sulloc tea, through interactive exhibits, traditional tea ceremonies, and beautiful displays.

Mt Songak – Songaksan Mountain is a mountain formed by underwater volcanic activity, characterized by its dual volcanic cones, which hold significant geological value. Along the Songaksan Trail, hikers can enjoy breathtaking coastal landscapes, including views of Hyeongjeseom Island, Gapado Island, and Marado Island.

Jusangjeolli Hexagon Lava Cliff – A stunning natural formation of hexagonal basalt columns created by volcanic activity, when lava from a volcanic eruption cooled rapidly upon contact with the ocean.

Mt. Halla 1100 Altitude Wetland – This unique ecosystem is home to diverse plant species, including rare alpine flora, and offers visitors scenic walking trails through lush vegetation, marshes, and ponds.

VISAS:

A visa is not required for Australian passport holders for entry into South Korea for stays up to 90 days.
