DETAILED ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrive Seoul

Arrive in South Korea's capital, Seoul, where you will be met by a driver and transferred to your hotel for check-in.

Enjoy the rest of your day at leisure.

This dynamic city is particularly fast-forward for everything from fashion to technology, but it is still deeply rooted in tradition.



Destination Information

Seoul — Seoul is a dynamic metropolis where skyscrapers, shopping malls and pop culture meet Buddhist temples, palaces and street markets. Seoul was the capital of Korea from 1394 until the formal division of the country in 1948. Its history stretches back over two thousand years, the name itself has come to mean “capital” in the Korean language.

Day 2: Explore Seoul

Meals: B, L

You will be picked up from your hotel to begin your full day seat-in-coach tour of the city. Your first stop will be at Cheongwadae, the former residence and office of the President of South Korea. Continue to Gyeongbok Palace, where, as well as exploring, you will see the Royal Guard Changing Ceremony, before visiting Jogyesa Temple.

After lunch, take a stroll along Insadong Street, home to a plethora of antique shops and traditional tea houses, then go on to visit N Seoul Tower for panoramic views over the city. Your last stop of the day is Hanok Village, a historic district featuring rows of traditional houses.



Transfer back to your hotel and enjoy the remainder of your day at leisure.

Please note, if today's date falls on a Tuesday, your itinerary may differ due to the Gyeongbok Palace being closed on Tuesdays.

Destination Information

Cheongwadae – Also known as the Blue House, Cheongwadae is the former residence and office of the President of South Korea. Located in the heart of Seoul, it is a symbol of the country's political power and heritage. Today, it serves as both a working presidential office and a historical site, showcasing traditional Korean architectural elements with modern influences.

Gyeongbok Palace – Built in 1395, Gyeongbok Palace was located at the heart of newly appointed capital of Seoul (then known as Hanyang) and was the main royal palace of the Joseon Dynasty. The palace has been rebuilt after destruction several times, and houses museums, ornamental gardens and some of Seoul's most outstanding architectural sights.

Jogyesa Temple – Built in the 14th century, it is one of the most important Buddhist temples in Korea and a symbol of Korean Buddhism. It serves as the head temple of Jogye order.

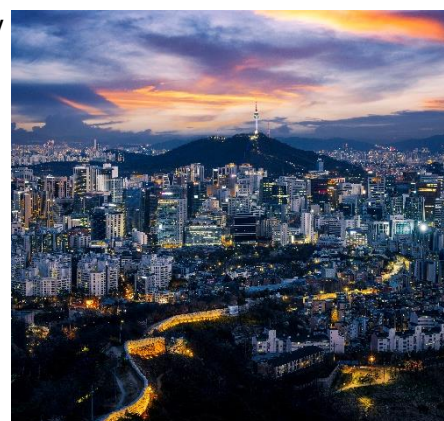
N Seoul Tower – The N Seoul Tower, built in 1969, is a communication and observation tower located on Namsan Mountain. At 236 metres, it is the second highest point in Seoul.

Hanok Village – A charming historic neighborhood that preserves traditional Korean architecture and provides a glimpse to Korea's past, featuring well-preserved hanok houses throughout narrow lanes. Many of the hanoks are still inhabited, creating a unique blend of old and new.

Day 3: Discover Seoul

Meals: B

After breakfast, enjoy the day at leisure to explore the many sights and sounds of the vast metropolis that is Seoul.

SEOUL EXTENSION TRAVEL INFORMATION

VISAS:

A visa is not required for Australian passport holders for entry into South Korea for stays up to 90 days.

INSURANCE:
